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When the release of AutoCAD coincided with the widespread acceptance of personal computers, the first personal computer-based CAD programs began to appear in 1986. AutoCAD was followed by AutoCAD LT and MicroStation which could be used on a smaller desktop computer, and Autodesk's AutoCAD Map 3D was introduced in 1988. AutoCAD 2.5 introduced the dimensional (DWG) format in 1991. AutoCAD 2D was released in 1993. AutoCAD was the first widely used computer-aided design program. For this reason, it is often referred to as the "first CAD program." AutoCAD was originally designed as a "networking" or "network" software application, to allow different users to access one another's designs from different workstations. The European Union had formally moved on Wednesday to designate Islamist groups as terrorist organizations, closing a chapter in a legal dispute that has dragged on for years. The European Parliament voted to approve the designation, a step that will give countries the right to freeze the funds of designated groups and to freeze the assets of their leaders. On a significant victory for the bloc, the vote on Wednesday followed months of negotiations with countries that had expressed reservations. The dispute began in 2003 when the EU reached an agreement on banning direct financing of terrorist groups. But some of the parties that have backed it, including the United States, Canada and Israel, continue to allow funding through channels that avoid banks and currency exchanges. Consequently, the measures approved on Wednesday allow European countries to designate groups that are linked to the Palestinian militant group Hamas and the Muslim Brotherhood in Egypt, which the United States has designated as terrorist organizations. They also include the Jihadist group Hezbollah, which both the European Union and the United States have also classified as a terrorist organization. Under the agreement, sanctions will remain in place for five years, a period that could be extended if the EU holds consultations with the countries concerned. Wednesday's vote represents a "historic victory" for European security, said Helga Schmid, a German member of the parliament's security committee. "In a sense," she said, "it's the result of years of work." The EU began working on the legislation three years ago, but it faced opposition from several governments, notably in Eastern Europe and in France, that were concerned about the effects on trade. They also objected to labeling Islamist organizations as terrorist ones. With the vote Wednesday, "it shows that the EU is willing to take decisions and to make adjustments," said Jan Philipp Albrecht, a German member of the parliament and a supporter of the EU's action.
